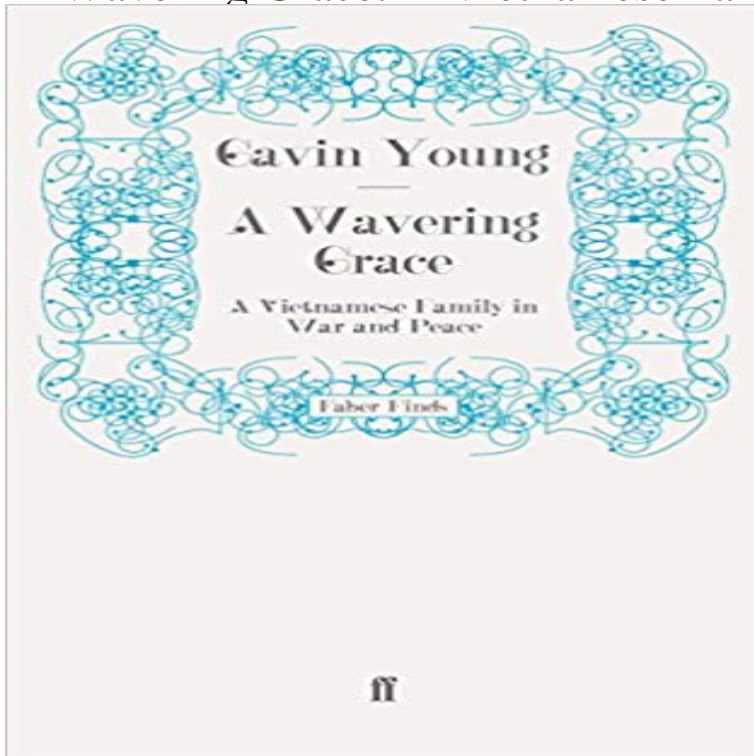


A Wavering Grace: A Vietnamese Family in War and Peace



Winter Song is the fourth book in the five novel Furrys sequence. All five novels have been reissued by Faber Finds. Self-contained, as all the others are, it can be read with satisfaction on its own but if read as part of the continuum an even richer enjoyment is gained. As an Observer correspondent in Vietnam before the American withdrawal in 1975, Gavin Young met many courageous Vietnamese people. He frequently stayed with one such person, Madame Bong, a woman who had lost her husband when she was only twenty-five, had recovered the mangled limbs of one son from a battlefield and watched as another son was sent off to a re-education camp for seven years. When Young was allowed to return to Vietnam he helped many of Madame Bongs relatives emigrate to the US.
