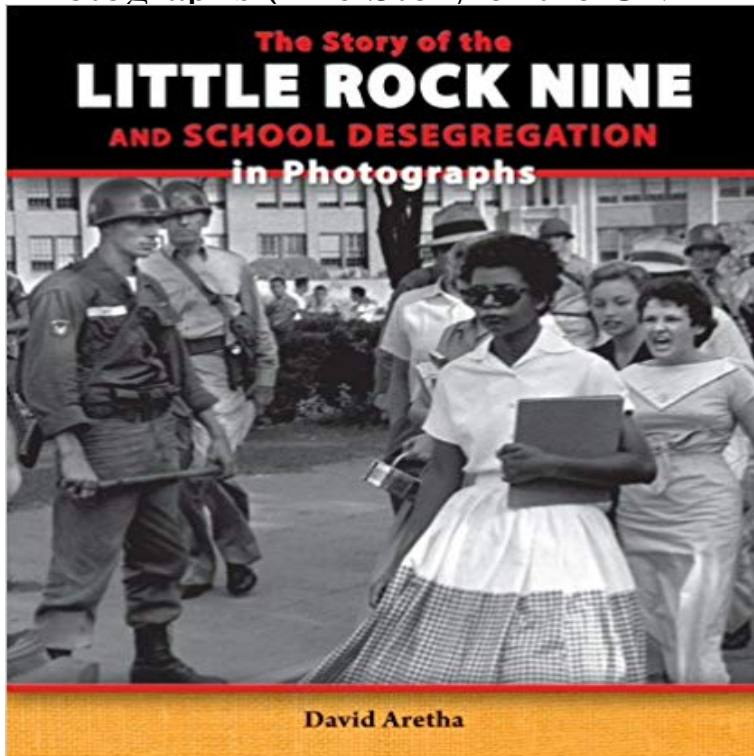


The Story of the Little Rock Nine and School Desegregation in Photographs (The Story of the Civil Rights Movement in Photographs)
