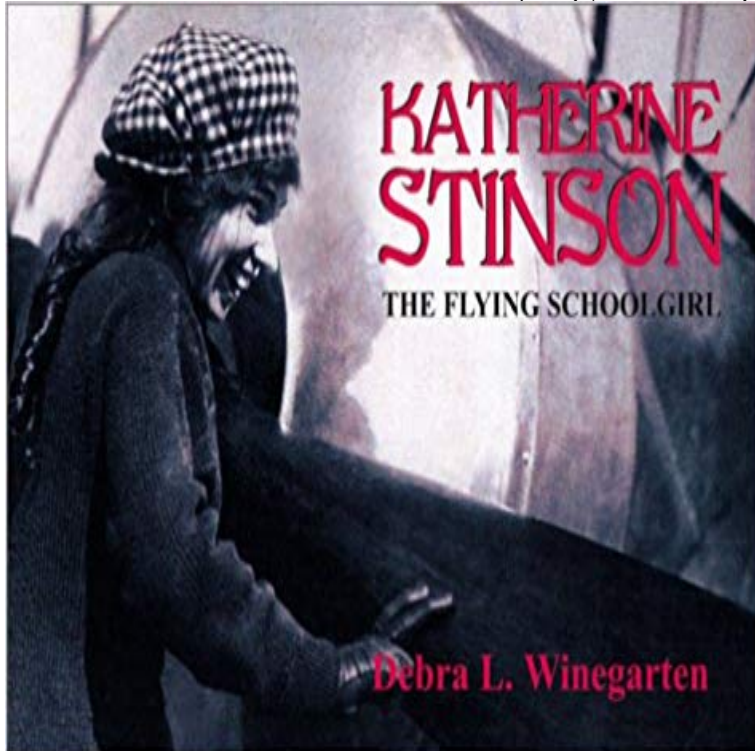


Katherine Stinson: The Flying Schoolgirl
