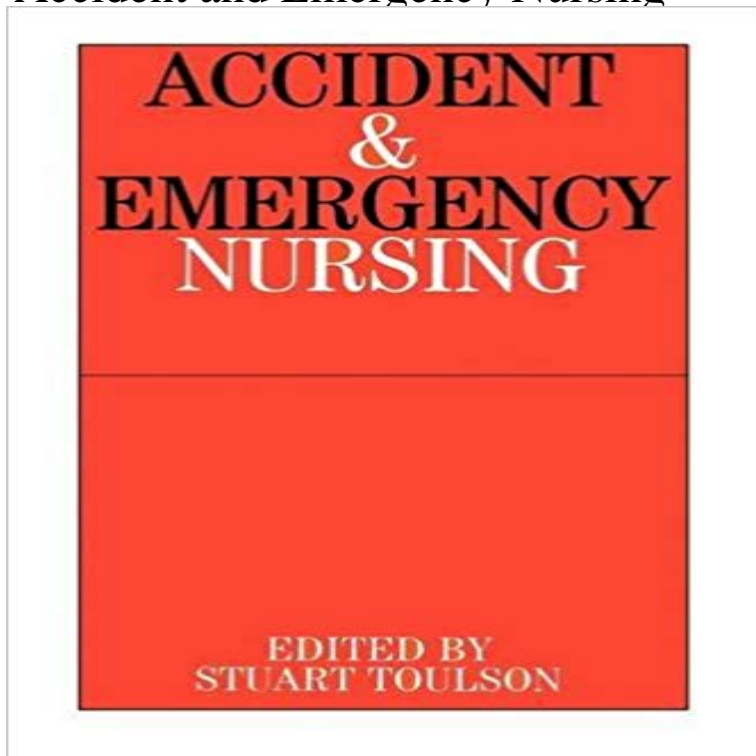


## Accident and Emergency Nursing
